Emergency Medicine	Current Role: Dr. Williamson's current role in Opioid addiction management came from a concern about the overdose deaths we were experiencing in the community in October of 2016. Outside of work, he started networking to better understand the community-based support groups in the area so that he could better refer patients from the ED who were seeking help but not desiring admission.	
	Dr. Williamson then educated his-self, through several online courses provided through Harvard Medical School, about Buprenorphine and Medication Assisted Treatment and became waivered to prescribe it. He briefly started prescribing to a few appropriate patients hoping to bridge their treatment into the community MAT providers who have waiting lists of several months. Simultaneously, he began learning about and increasing use of non-opioid pain management such as ultrasound guided peripheral blocks and other modes of treatment.	
	Dr. Williamson has served as the Medical Director of Addiction Services at one of the hospital's outpatient clinics for two months. He agreed to take on this role while further developing a template for a bridge clinic, connecting ED patients to long-term care. As part of this new role he was sent to the yearly American Society for Addiction Medicine in early April 2018 where he was happy to learn that much of the cutting-edge research for opioid addiction treatment incorporates care received in the ED.	
	Additional Information: Dr. Williamson is passionate about this issue and truly believes that for some, MAT is the only avenue to recovery from opioid addiction and all the maladies that are associated with it.

He is currently implementing the Rapid Hip Program at his facility. He is also an active member of the Drug Diversion Prevention Committee at his hospital and an active member of ASA and FSA.
James Baird	Experience: EMS Medical Director for two years and EM physician for four years.
Emergency Medicine	Current Role: Assistant Medical Director for one year for TeamHealth. Additional Information: Dr. Baird was selected to participate for re-educating our ED providers at our 3-hospital system on proper opioid prescribing which has led to a 50.2% overall decrease in opioid prescriptions and a 95.2% decrease in "high prescribers". He was able to start a Recovery Coach program that links our substance use patient with a recovery coach who helps them get into treatment and follows each individual patient into recovery. Last year, 178 people entered treatment with close to 80% of our patients still working a program and heading towards recovery from their addiction.
	Dr. Baird is currently working on developing an Emergency Department Medication Assistant Treatment (MAT) program where his team will screen patients for opioid use disorder (OUD) and administer/prescribe Suboxone while linking them with outpatient MAT and an addiction treatment program. He has many policies that have been approved and implemented, not just in the ED, but within the hospital as well. He meets on a regular basis with our county, state and federal legislators regarding barriers to addiction treatment, both within the health system and outside of it. He participates on six Opioid and Addiction Task Forces. He works with local addiction services on collaborating with his hospital to accept their patients directly into their programs to avoid waiting times.
Joe Chow	Dr. Baird co-chairs two hospital committees, one for the above work, and the other to review our pain management protocols and edit based on current recommendations on non-opioids first (when possible) and then safe administration of opioids as second line. He helped create a naloxone (Narcan) program as a harm reduction program to our EDs to hand our "naloxone kits' which contain educational information and a dose of Narcan to our patients who overdosed. He also extended this program as a pilot program to local EMS agencies for those who refuse treatment after Narcan reversal. Dr. Baird is currently working with NJ Department of Health to share his team's Narcan data in order to provide a better data analysis on the overdose epidemic. 	Additional Information: Dr. Khan recently finished training to prescribe Suboxone. He is a member of Clermont County overdose death review. They meet every 6 months with community leaders, law enforcement and elected officials to review trends and provide recommendations to reduce overdose deaths. Dr. Khan is also a member of the Clermont County Board of Health. A recent success was the implementation of a needle exchange program.
	Dr. Khan believes that the number one thing to decrease opiate deaths and misuse is to develop a culture that is based on respect for the staff and patients. His team implemented a program at his facility that involves tracking of opiate prescribing, providing individual feedback regarding opiate administration practices in morphine equivalents compared to peers and opiate sparing therapies for the ED patients. His team prescribes Naloxone kits and provides resources for home visits/ community outreach programs for select patients who are willing to accept help that have been to the ED with an overdose. His team maintains strict compliance with Ohio opiate prescribing guidelines.
	Dr. Khan is currently implementing guidelines and an order set for the services outside of the ED to consistently and humanely care for patients who are hospitalized who suffer from an addiction problem. The order set includes therapies to reduce symptoms associated with drug withdrawal for patients that do not have a painful condition and guidelines and talking points for the staff to share with patients when they are hospitalized with a painful condition. Since they are also seeing more patients hospitalized associated with stimulant type intoxications, and this has been associated with injuries to the nurses, the order set also provides guidelines for the use of sedative agents.

	Additional Information: In March of 2017, Dr. McLeod and team began an Opioid Light ED program. They developed order sets, trained providers and staff, and developed opioid use reports. Within one year, they reduced their opioid use by 70% in the ED. Their Press-Ganey score went up by 30 points for pain management questions. This surprised the team, but Dr. McLeod felt it was because they were all on the same page. Where they used to avoid the narcotic requesting patient, they now had alternatives to use, and they all did the same thing, so they spent more time in the room with the patient. Dr. McLeod's team also reported un-blinded data on how they all performed.
	The program was presented at the HCA TN State meeting, and it was selected as the program that the state would implement. Dr. McLeod's team recently developed an opioid harm reduction info packet that is given to patients with an overdose or addiction problem.

The council is responsible for PALTC Pearls. which are one pager education or information released biweekly to all PAC clinicians. **Additional Information:** Currently there are legislative changes in Michigan regarding opioid prescribing with profound effects on clinician workflow and call coverage.
